From 11 to 15 October, IED Barcelona joins forces with the Port de Barcelona to take part in the 61st edition of this event, showcasing projects that unite Design with the Blue Economy and, with just under a year remaining until the America's Cup is held in the Catalan capital, seek to connect the city with the sea.



Barcelona, 4 October 2023.- In partnership with the Port de Barcelona, IED Barcelona will participate in the 61st edition of the Barcelona International Boat Show, running from 11 to 15 October. It will do so with two notable interventions at the Àgora Port tent that the Port de Barcelona will set up in Plaça del Portal de la Pau to serve as a stand in the outdoor facilities of the trade fair grounds. The activities developed by IED will address the role of design in caring for oceans and marine environments, helping to strengthen the links between the people of Barcelona and their port, when there is less than a year remaining until the next America's Cup is held in the Catalan capital.


IED projects, a sea of creativity and design
